

Carnival in the district of Nuoro is rich in evocative and interesting events. Its main features are the mysterious and archaic masks that move silently along the streets with a rhythmic gait, thus retracing the land tilling rituals. You can admire the different typical masks on Sunday and on Mardi Gras: Ottana's *Boes e Merdules*, Orotelli's *Thurpos*, Mamoiada's *Mamuthones e Issohadores*. Mardi Gras is Bosa's most important day. Its masks are dressed in black, as the Carnival draws to an end. *Giolzi*, a rag doll embodying Carnival, is eventually burned on a pyre. Another event you can't miss is Ovodda's Carnival on Ash Wednesday, which is considered the most transgressive carnival party of Nuoro's district, where you can't avoid the rite of being painted with soot.
